- 1) Only the Homeowner may submit this form to the Board.
- 2) If applicable, this form must be proceeded by a Structural Alteration/Addition to a Building Concern Form.
- 3) Dumpsters, containers, and/or portable bathrooms are limited, outside/on-site, to 45 calendar days.
- 4) Dumpsters and containers must be placed on the sidewalk side of the driveway, off the grass. Portable bathrooms must be set on the side of the home (behind the garage door) or behind the home and only on the homeowner's property. Any damage (e.g., pavement, lawn) must be repaired immediately following removal.
- 5) Portable bathrooms must be serviced regularly. If possible, schedule construction to maintain operational indoor facilities.
- 6) All other debris (e.g., building materials) must be stored in the garage.
- 7) No deposit of any construction materials or liquids in a storm drain is allowed.
- 8) The Homeowner is responsible for clearing snow from the driveway and sidewalks if the association is unable to access these areas.
- 9) The Homeowner is responsible for informing his/her contractor of the CPHA rules and regulations and enforcing compliance.
